ROMTHE At our last Session Meeting, approval was given for our Choir to sing on Easter Sunday. Last Sunday morning, before our Worship Service, our Choir gathered and practiced for the first time in a year; in spite of wearing masks while we sang, it was a wonderful time for all present. I point this out because while our Choir does not have the time to prepare a traditional cantata/musical for Easter, we will be presenting several pieces of special music that morning. This extra music, coupled with the celebration of Holy Communion and the possible observance of the Sacrament of Baptism on that day, has resulted in the necessity of beginning our Worship Service a little earlier than usual: On Easter Sunday, our Worship Service will begin at 10:30 a.m., instead of the normal 10:45 a.m. We will not have our traditional SonRise Service in our Chapel at 8:00 a.m., nor the Continental Breakfast that normally takes place between the early service and Sunday School.

As the threat of COVID-19 continues to lessen and several members of our Church Family have already received one of the available vaccines and more receiving their vaccination each week, our Session is considering when to resume our Sunday School program. To this end, our adult teachers are currently gathering input from their class members as to their comfort level for them and their children/grandchildren returning to Sunday School. At our next Session Meeting (Sunday evening, March 28th), we will consider all this information and make a decision.

#### Egg Hunt

This year's Egg Hunt will be on Saturday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>, from 11:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon. This will be an outdoor only event; in case of inclement weather, the hunt will be canceled. No indoor activities or luncheon will be part of this year's event; however, we will play outdoor games and have a prepackaged snack bag for each child. Masks will be required for all adults and children over the age of twelve. Each household in the congregation is asked to donate a few dozen candy-filled eggs (prepackaged, individually-wrapped candy only) between now and Sunday, March 28th; a collection box is in the Church Office. Egg-hiders will wear plastic gloves when "hiding" the eggs.

#### Knox County COVOD-19 Update

According to the Knox County Health Department, as of Sunday, March 14<sup>th</sup>, Knox County has had 40,691 confirmed cases of COVID-19, 1,289 of which have required hospitalization at some point during their illness. There are currently 1,048 probable and confirmed cases. Throughout the county, 31 patients are currently hospitalized with COVID-19 and the total number of deaths has now increased to 594. Though the pandemic is not over, the trend in recent weeks continues to be encouraging. As always, this information is given to help you best determine whether it is best for you to venture out to church or elsewhere or to stay at home.

Because of your previous generosity, we will not be raising any funds to purchase food this year; however, your help is still needed.
