Though Mother's Day has passed, I want to share the tribute to mothers that I gave during last Sunday's Worship Service: "Mothers come in all forms: most are biological, but some are adoptive; some are step; some are foster; some are grandmothers who raised us; some are aunts and neighbors and church ladies who watched out for our well-being and loved and cared for us. All are worthy of honor because they loved us unconditionally, taught us invaluable life-lessons, corrected and disciplined us when we were wrong, worried about us, laughed and cried with us, and hugged us when we needed it most. Though there are sad exceptions, a mother's love is absolute, pure, and everlasting. Our mothers become the rock upon which we stand, the fortress that protects our family, and the strength we thought we did not have. Thank you ladies for being our mothers!"

I also want to share the three main points and the closing question and final remark from last Sunday's sermon based on **John 13:31-35**, which records Jesus telling His followers to love one another; this instruction is sometimes referred to as "The Eleventh Commandment". 1) "Mother's Day reminds us that a mother's love is generally the nearest thing to Christ's love that we have on this earth. This is because both a mother's love and Jesus' love involve making sacrifices." 2) "Both a mother's love and Jesus' love involve sharing." And 3) "Both a mother's love and Jesus' love involve serving." Now my closing question and final remark: "Are we keeping "The Eleventh Commandment"; that is, do we love one another enough to sacrifice, enough to share, enough to serve?' If you do, then our future as a congregation is extremely bright."

# 2021 Denomination Day Celebration

There will not be a meal offered due to the ongoing pandemic. Face masks are encouraged, but not required.
